GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY IMPORTANCE BRAZILIAN VEGETATION

the greatest biodiversity on the planet



55,000 native plant species in six major biomes:

- * Amazon (30,000);
- Cerrado (10,000);
- Caatinga (4,000);
- Atlantic rainforest (10,000),
- × Pantanal (10,000)
- subtropical forest (3,000)


GLOBAL BIODIVERSITY IMPORTANCE

AMAZON RAINFOREST

* the most species-rich biome on the Earth

* trees: may grow 1000 species per sq / km


(compare: total Czech Rep. – 70 native tree species












ECONOMIC IMPORTANCE


- source for pharmaceutical industries (mostly Western countries)
- source of wood (mostly consumed by Brazilians, mahagony exported)
- Iarge potential for nature-based tourism

BRAZILIAN AMAZONIA



- global importance of ecosystems and biodiversity
- world-wide concern about the status of Amazonia forests, biodiversity and climate effect

- a wide-spread opinion in Brazil:
- * foreigners threaten our sovereignty over Amazonia
- conspire to internationalize/take over Amazonia

INDIAN POPULATION IN BRAZIL

- Indigenos/Indian population:
- before European arrival: est. 7 millions
- reduced by assimilation, and European diseases
- currently:150 000 800 000 peopleincl. about 50 uncontactedtribes



- involvement of local/indigenous people
- effective communication and negotiation
- 2. conflict management







RECONCILIATION OF VALUES & INTERESTS


Expanding and reinforcing the system of conservation units

- strictly protected areas
- sustainable use areas (intention: multiple use)



RECONCILIATION OF VALUES & INTERESTS

- poverty alleviation aspects in conservation programs
- yes however, need to consider limits of sources and efficiency (programs in urban favelas are more efficient)



ECONOMIC ASPECTS

avoidance of perverse public subsidies/support

(support of clearing of forest for cattle ranching)

consideration of longterm effects of largescale investments on small business operators

(local rubber tappers and Brazil nut collectors, local fishermen, ecotourism operators



SUSTAINABILITY OF AMAZONIA

- strictly protected areas surrounded by the protected areas of multiple use
- indigenous tribal lands can play a vital role (finish demarcation)
- sustainable development for those that want to protect the environment
