Entrance exams are held in the form of an online test in English language, i.e.

- for all Bachelor's Degree study programmes in a full-time form of study,
- for all Bachelor's Degree study programmes conducted in English in the part-time form of study (Anglophone Studies),
- for Master's Degree programmes in full-time and part-time forms of study conducted in English.

Applicants for Bachelor's Degree programmes in the part-time form of study conducted in Czech and to all Master's degree programmes conducted in Czech are admitted without entrance examinations.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE (Bc. degree)

- The standard length of study for both the full-time and part-time form is 3 years.
- Admission to study is conditioned by finished secondary education proved by an officially certified copy of high school diploma or its equivalent in case of study at a high school abroad (with a certificate of recognition, i.e. "nostrification").
- Requirements for entrance examinations for full-time form of study are detailed at individual programmes.
- There are no entrance examinations for programmes in the part-time form (except for Anglophone Studies).

MASTER'S DEGREE (Mgr. / Ing. degree)

- The standard length of study for both the full-time and part-time form is 2 years.
- Admission to study is conditioned by finished university education on at least Bachelor level, proved by an officially certified copy of a diploma. Graduates of study programmes that are not accredited in the Czech Republic enclose an officially certified copy of decision of recognition of the foreign university education.
- There are no entrance examinations for both full-time and part time form of study (except for programmes in English).

Finishing studies:

- writing and defending a Master Thesis
- passing the Final State Examination

FULL-TIME FORM OF STUDY

- The full-time form of study takes place on daily basis from Monday to Friday. As we are aware that most students have a job while studying, classes are mostly scheduled into two or three weekdays.

PART-TIME FORM OF STUDY

- The part-time form of study combines attendance at school with self-study.
- In Bachelor programmes, classes take place on Saturdays five times during a semester.
- In the 1st and 2nd year of Bachelor programmes, two Saturdays are reserved for English classes. Students with adequate knowledge of English can have these classes recognized with an international or a Czech certificate or pass a certificate exam at MUP before classes start; they do not have to attend these classes in that case. We also offer the option to take English classes on weekdays with the full-time programme classes to students who find the classes on Saturdays inconvenient.
- In Master programmes, classes take place on 7 Saturdays per semester in the 1st year and on 4 or 5 Saturdays per semester in the 2nd year.

Once per an academic year, every student can apply for the change of the form of study. You can thus dynamically adjust your study according to your needs.

RIGOROSUM PROCEEDINGS (PhDr. degree)

- Initiating rigorosum proceedings is conditioned by a finished Master degree in the study programme in which the rigorosum proceedings take place or in a similar study programme. For more information, see the chapter dedicated to the relevant programme.

Requirements for admission:

- Proposal of the intended Rigorosum Thesis comprising the following:
 - title of the thesis
 - definition of the topic
 - theoretical framework
 - approximate time frame of finishing the thesis
 - applied research methods
 - list of information sources

DOCTORAL DEGREE (Ph.D. degree)

- The standard length of study in both the full-time and part-time form is 3 years.
- Admission to study is conditioned by a finished university study at least on Master level, proved by an officially certified copy of a diploma. Graduates of study programmes that are not accredited in the Czech Republic enclose an officially certified copy of decision of recognition of the foreign university education.
- Requirements for entrance examinations for full-time form of study are detailed at individual programmes.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE (Bc.)

- The standard length of study in both the full-time and part-time form is 3 years.
- Admission to study is conditioned by finished secondary education proved by an officially certified copy of high school diploma or its equivalent in case of study at a high-school abroad (with a certificate of recognition, i.e. "nostrification").
- Requirements for entrance examinations for full-time form of study are detailed at individual programmes.
- There are no entrance examinations for programmes in the part-time form (except for Anglophone Studies).

FULL-TIME FORM OF STUDY

- The full-time form of study is based on daily instruction from Monday to Friday. As we are aware that most students also work during their studies, timetables are usually focused into two or three work days.

PART-TIME FORM OF STUDY

- It combines participation on instruction and self-study.
- The instruction takes place five times during a semester on Saturdays.
- In the 1st and 2nd year, two Saturdays will be dedicated to English lessons. Students with appropriate level in English can have the examination recognized with an international or Czech certificate or they can pass a certification examination at MUP before the beginning of instruction – in such a case, they do not need to be present for English lessons. Students who do not find taking English lessons on Saturdays convenient can participate on full-time form of study lectures on work days.
- Students will use e-learning and there will be an electronic database and study materials at their disposal.

Every student can apply for change of their form of study once in every academic year. You can thus adjust your studies according to your needs.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- study programmes in Czech - full-time form of study: English language exam (online).
- study programmes in Czech - part-time form of study: no entrance examinations.
- study programmes in English - full-time and part-time form of study: English language exam (online).

Applicants who give evidence that they passed a national or international examination or received a certificate proving their English is at least on the B2 level will be accepted for study without passing the entrance examinations. THE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION CONSISTS OF:

- The **specialisation-related examination** which takes the form of a critical discussion with the Entrance Examination Committee in the English language on subject matters relating to the specialisation, and is based on the documents submitted together with the application. The applicant’s interest in the area of study, his/her knowledge of the subject matter, and his/her overall qualification for Doctoral Degree studies are assessed
- The **examination in English** which consists of an interview conducted in the English language about the applicant’s relation to the area of study and the Doctoral Thesis topic; reading of a specialised text in English and its oral interpretation, and – as the case may be – of supplementary questions regarding English grammar. Each part of the entrance examination shall be evaluated according to the following scale: 1 - excellent, 2 - very good, 3 - good, 4 - fail. Should any part of the examination be evaluated as 4, i.e. fail, the applicant shall fail the entrance examination.



DOCTORAL DEGREE

POLITICAL SCIENCE

Doctoral Degree in Political Science focuses on education of highly specialised expert in the area of research of politics and political processes. The structure of the study takes into account the basic political paradigms, methods and subfields while its dominant focus is on the study of politics in Central and Central-Eastern Europe. The study also puts emphasis on transdisciplinary approaches, especially in regards to blending of political science and communication studies, modern and contemporary history, political sociology and political anthropology.

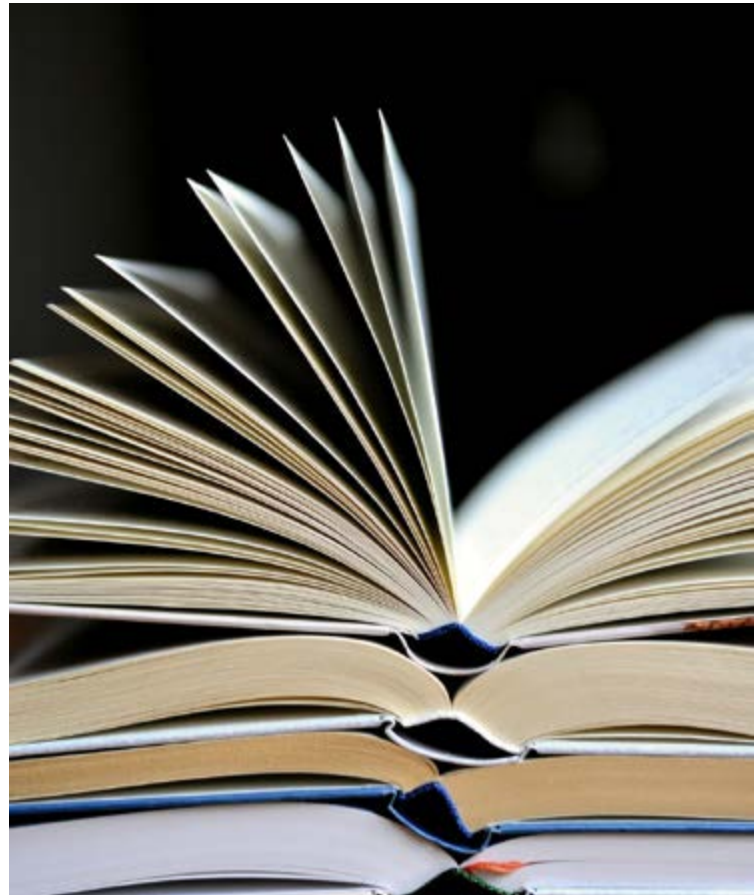

ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

- Participants in the Rigorosum Proceedings take the Rigorosum Examination after they submit their Rigorosum Thesis
- The examination consists of two separate oral parts, each evaluated on its own. The first part is general and focuses on basic orientation in Political Sciences and their main sub-fields. The second part is specialised and the participant of the Rigorosum proceedings choose from four areas depending on their preferences.
- For both the general and the free-choice part, participants in the Rigorosum Proceedings are provided with an indicative list of literature for study. During the examination, participants should be able to show their knowledge of the topics to which these titles are dedicated. It is assumed that participants know the contents of all titles on the list for the general examination and a half of the titles for the chosen specialised examination. As an alternative or complement, participants of the Rigorosum Proceedings may present the commission with their own list of studied literature before the examination – nevertheless their list should focus on the same topics and main areas of study as the original list.
- Both examinations take place in the form of interview and the members of the commission have 1–3 inquiries for each question based on the list of sources or to be more precise they present topics for the participant of the Rigorosum Proceedings to present their knowledge of the given field of Political Sciences.

LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

The International Office of Metropolitan University Prague administers study stays and traineeships for MUP students both within and outside the Erasmus+ programme. SCHOOL WITHOUT BARRIERS

Metropolitan University Prague has been implementing the “School without Barriers” programme from its own financial sources since 2003. This programme enables applicants with disabilities to study at MUP. Pursuant to MUP Bursary Code, students with disabilities can apply for disbursement of a bursary for their whole course of study at MUP. This programme allows MUP applicants with disabilities to study in fully barrier-free buildings.

The Programme Includes:

- bursary in the amount of 90% of the tuition fees for the whole course of study (student who was granted the bursary shall pay only 10% of the total sum of tuition fees per academic year)
- barrier-free study environment in MUP buildings
- possibility of having a special study regime
- individualised forms of communication
- ability to consult with the Counsellor for Students with Disabilities
- loan of equipment needed for study (notebooks, voice recorders, relevant literature, voice transcription software and rhetoric courses to ensure its correct use)

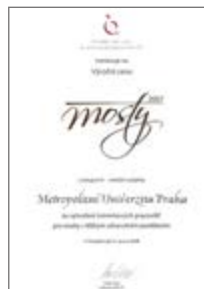

STUDENTS AND GRADUATES

A total of 350 students took part in the programme; among them 220 students have already completed the full course of their studies successfully. They also study abroad at universities in the EU within the framework of the Erasmus programme and take part in internships abroad.



JIŘÍ HÁJEK SPECIALISED LIBRARY

The collections of Jiří Hájek Specialised Library at Metropolitan University Prague comprise study-related literature for all specialisations taught at the university. In addition, it offers access to professional periodicals published both in Czechia and abroad as well as access to a multitude of electronic resources. The library provides loans and other study-related services, such as access to online databases, copy machines, and sale of books published by MUP Press.

BURSARIES

• Economic hardship and accommodation bursaries

The Metropolitan University Prague Bursary Code allows students to apply for economic hardship and accommodation bursaries. Their amount depends on the subsidy provided by the Ministry of Education, Youth, and Sports of the Czech Republic.

• Bursary for students with physical disabilities

A bursary can be granted in the form of a waiver of a part of tuition fees to students who were accepted to study in Bachelor's or Master's degree programmes within the "School Without Barriers" programme and they hold severe health disability card (ZTP) or severe health disability requiring special assistance card (ZTP/P) or they present a confirmation of their disability. Waiver for other fees connected to study is not a part of the bursary for students with physical disability. Further information is detailed in the MUP Bursary Code and the MUP List of Fees at www.mup.cz.

• Doctoral bursary

According to the MUP Bursary Code, Doctoral bursaries may be granted to Students enrolled in the full-time form of study of Doctoral Degree study programmes. The doctoral bursary consists of one part, which is a waiver of tuition fees in full. The maximum number of students who can be granted the full doctoral bursary in one academic year is stipulated in the MUP List of Fees.

• Research, development, and innovations bursaries

According to the MUP Bursary Code, research, development, and innovations bursaries are granted to students of Master's or Doctoral degree study programmes who participate on internal grant projects within IGS MUP.
